It's hard to believe this type of response to education is possible, until you've experienced Sonlight.

Sonlight's roots: how a reluctant homeschooler started a movement

When John Holzmann suggested to his wife Sarita that they might want to consider homeschooling, she said, "You aren't going to tie me down like that!"

But after looking at all the possibilities, she reluctantly agreed that there were no other options if she were to give her children a quality education.

Thirty years ago, no company scheduled real books into a complete course of study. Sarita didn't want to teach her children any other way, so she scheduled the books she loved and read them to her children.

To her surprise, she found that she loved homeschooling.

Around that same time, she learned that missionaries left the mission field because they didn't want to send their children to boarding school.

One day a friend said to Sarita, "You know, you could pull together the best of the best books, and a schedule, and ship them to missionaries around the world. That could keep them on the field one more year!"

This seemed like a productive way to use her son's nap time, and so Sonlight was born. Sarita wanted to allow other families to experience the same benefits that she did: the same enjoyment of great books, the same deep conversations, the same broad knowledge of cultural literacy.

And for almost thirty years, thousands of families around the world have lived this dream of how education could be different. They read delightful books, and grow a heart for the world.

Books are at the center of Sonlight

Sonlight uses outstanding books and delightful stories as the centerpiece for learning. This is why Sonlight is considered a "literature-rich" curriculum. What makes a Sonlight book

Every book in Sonlight has to pass Sarita's 7-point test.

- 1. Real/realistic characters. Heroes should not be flawless. Anti-heroes ought not to be thoroughly detestable. All characters need to be nuanced and complex—the way real people really are.
- **2. Solid character development.** The protagonist must change for the better over the course of the book.
- 3. Intriguing, multi-dimensional plot.
- 4. Content that adds to the reader's cultural literacy. The book's plot, setting, characters, or vocabulary—something—must contribute to your knowledge about world events and cultures or your understanding of "the way things work" in human relations and in life.
- **5. Emotionally compelling.** The story has to move you.
- 6. Beautifully written. The words themselves must be superb and allow for fluent reading, whether silently or out loud.
- **7. Re-readable.** You have to want to read it over and over again.

Sonlight does not include trite or formulaic books, nor dry-as-dust tomes that exist solely to pump the mind full of facts and figures.

Out of every thousand books Sarita reads, she finds only a few that might merit becoming part

of a Sonlight program. That's how few books there are that have the depth, the beauty, the cultural sensitivity, the inspiration, or the winsome, scholarly character she wants you to share with your children.

Sonlight books make you think

A Sonlight education doesn't emphasize memorizing facts. Since the internet is always available to give you any information you might need—the length of the *Mayflower*, the 47th element on the Periodic Table, the 14th President of the United States, and so on—memorization today is less critical than it was even a generation ago.

Today, you are better served knowing what to look up and why—questions that are answered as a result of a big picture perspective—rather than knowing "the answer."

Therefore, Sonlight's philosophy is not to aim for either efficiency or a finish line. Rather, it is aiming for connection and a love of learning that continues even when school is done. Happily, a literature-rich education ends up being surprisingly efficient. You read books to your children, and they absorb the information. You talk about what you read and

then move on. No stressful studying for tests. No boring lectures. Instead, you get enjoyable reading, thinking and interacting.

As one Sonlighter wrote:

Retraining our daughter to use her brain instead of just memorizing facts has been a challenge, but what a happy day when she gave her first tentative opinion about the underlying meaning of something that we were reading. She's no longer phrasing her thoughts as questions, and THAT alone has made the curriculum and time investment worth it.

As Sonlight students successfully move on to careers in the sciences, the arts, business, and missions, their critical thinking skills and creativity is in demand, no matter what path they pursue as adults.

And you'll have a chance to reply to your children's questions. You get to talk about things like character development, faith, citizenship, our role in the world, politics, and God. And from time to time you may find that your children's questions lead to entire conversations—the kind of conversations that will shape their thoughts and values. You'll

have the opportunity to pass on your family stories, your life experience, and your worldview.

If you find that two books disagree, point out the disagreement—and pursue a solution to the problem. Show your children, by example, how mature, educated people interact when they disagree with materials.

There are areas of life—skills, perspectives, attitudes—you can never pass on to your children through words alone: things like a positive self-esteem; a sense of belonging and of being loved; a love for learning; and an appreciation for beauty. All of these are attitudes, values and methods you do pass on to your children when you interact with them.

Many Sonlight parents find that their children turn to them for insight and guidance, not only when their children are young, but also as they move into adulthood, because of the hours they spent sharing experiences and thoughtful conversations together.



Since God's heart is for the world, you'll teach about the world right from the start. Starting with a true story set in Thailand in the Preschool program, and continuing each year, your children will meet (and pray for) people from many cultures.

With this global perspective, Sonlight offers the opportunity for your children to understand their role in what God is doing in the world.

Inspire your children to honor Christ boldly.

Our desire is that Sonlight students understand that they are part of God's plan, which is far bigger than they are. This plan has been carried forward through the centuries by "a great cloud" of faithful people who fulfilled their callings, often with great sacrifice (see Hebrews 12:1).

Paul calls us "ambassadors for Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:20). Ambassadors represent their home country in foreign places, communicating their home country's message to their hosts. They are the bridge between their home and their hosts.

What a wonderful calling! In order to train your children to become effective ambassadors, you help your children know both Christ and the Scriptures, as well as the people and culture around them

Effective ambassadors are familiar with the Truth and know their audience. They know the message they have been sent to share, and how to share it, taking into account what their hosts think, believe, and value. »

Raise "culturally literate" students.

We all need to know a certain basic set of background information if we want to get along in a culture, let alone influence it. We must be aware of the key historical events, significant people, movements, groups and ideas that have shaped our culture. With Sonlight, you'll read widely from carefully selected books that help your children become culturally literate adults. Your children will have a foundational base of knowledge.

More importantly, these books help prepare your children to respond to cultural influences in a godly way. Cultural literacy helps prepare students to become world-changers—people who make a difference for good.

Teach your students how to listen to others with confidence and with interest in other viewpoints.

"Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak" (James 1:19).

To communicate effectively for Christ, we might do well to listen twice as much as we talk.

Sonlight uses two methods to help your students learn to listen.

First, your children will listen while you read to them. Studies show that children develop better listening skills when their parents regularly read to them at length. Sonlight Read-Alouds help you love reading together daily, and so your children will learn to listen.

Second, Sonlight programs often present multiple sides of an argument. Your children listen to two perspectives on various issues and work to find quality solutions. Sonlight equips you to walk alongside your children as they learn the tools, techniques, knowledge, and skills of godly intellectual engagement.

Your students will learn that most issues have more than one perspective, and that, in the face of other perspectives, they need not mock nor cower. They can find answers to questions that challenge their point of view. There is no need to fear. They can be confident in the face of differing viewpoints.

Inspire students to be true scholars.

With Sonlight, your students go beyond simply memorizing information. They learn how to research, compare views, think critically, and explain their perspective articulately.

We believe true scholarship is an important step in preparing students to do whatever God calls them to do. Those who have "done their homework" are in far better positions than those who haven't learned to communicate effectively with people who hold different perspectives.

O Foster a love of learning.

What good does it do to fill children's minds with information if they never develop a sincere desire to learn and grow in wisdom? As Solomon said: "Blessed is the man who finds wisdom, the man who gains understanding, for she [wisdom] is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold. She is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her" (Proverbs 3:13-15).

Once your children want to learn, you have equipped them to keep learning throughout life. This allows them to press toward the goals God wants them to pursue.

Prepare students for thoughtful action on significant issues.

The Bible and other quality literature develop empathy, teach life lessons gracefully, and encourage students to search the Scriptures to find out how Jesus would respond in certain circumstances.

As your students read and think about serious social, personal, and ethical issues, they prepare themselves for times when they may face similar dilemmas. Can you imagine a more enjoyable way to gain wisdom and knowledge than to read great books?

1 C Launch mature adults.

The end result of education is not solely to create young people with brilliant minds. A brilliant mind, after all, can be turned to good or ill purposes.

Rather, you want your children to be mature adults, who make prudent decisions instead of self-destructive ones, who have purpose and direction instead of aimlessness, who are eager to serve the Lord and the body of Christ rather than living for themselves.

Sonlight students worldwide are discovering their gifts and using them to further God's kingdom in different ways.

One Sonlighter was recently the first in her family to graduate college. Another just started at Stanford. Another Sonlight grad is headed to the Navy to study nuclear engineering. Another student plans to be a medical missionary, while another is already working to fight human trafficking.

As you look at your goals for your homeschool, may you be inspired by how meaningful this calling is; may you be encouraged by how doable it is, through God's grace; may you be strengthened in the year to come as you raise and educate your children. •

Instructor's Guides (IGs)

Sonlight IGs contain your complete lesson plans, teaching resources, and notes for a year. See pp. 17-23 for more details.

Bible

All of the Sonlight programs come from a Christian perspective. Throughout your studies, the Instructor's Guide includes Scripture references and questions that seek to relate what you're reading to your faith.

But Sonlight also includes Bible as a separate subject.

Each Sonlight program schedules a Bible passage to read every day. By the time they graduate, your children will have read through most of the Bible more than once.

The schedule also suggests a weekly memory verse. These are set to music in Sonlight's level A through G programs, in albums that seek to match the general feel of the corresponding program. So in Sonlight F, a program that examines

world cultures, the album incorporates ethnic instruments and rhythms.

Besides Bible reading and Scripture memory, many programs also include age-appropriate additional books, such as Bible study guides, books on Christian practices like prayer, and books of apologetics. You and your children will read, talk about, and memorize Scripture so that God's Word becomes integral in your lives.

To help your children share God's heart for the world, many years include prayer guides to help you pray for unreached people groups around the world. Let your children begin now to change the world for Christ!

Sonlight programs also include at least one missionary biography. God is at work around the world, bringing transformation. How wonderful to witness that work, and to see how He uses ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things.

History

Big Picture

Sonlight's programs go through three cycles of history, nicely balanced between American and World History. Each time through, your children will gain a deeper understanding of what has happened and what God is doing. Since quality literature reaches children of various ages, you can use one HBL program with multiple children. (See p. 27 to learn about using one Sonlight program to teach more than one child.)


Sonlight also includes three years dedicated to important—but unusual!—topics.

• Sonlight level F (p. 62) focuses on the Eastern Hemisphere. The majority of the world lives here. And, even more importantly from the perspective of God's Kingdom, this is the area in which the largest number of cultural groups live without a viable church movement ("unreached peoples").

What's in Sonlight

- NEW! Sonlight Level J (p. 78) focuses on the History of Science. Learn the stories of creative thinkers and surprising discoveries over the last several thousand years. Even if your children are not highly STEM-oriented (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) this is a fascinating course. (And for the STEM-oriented students? A fantastic year!)
- Sonlight 200 (p. 127) focuses on the History of the Christian Church.

History Topics and Progression



In Daily Practice

A fascinating, story-based history book or series serves as the "spine" for each HBL program. You gradually read through this book, mostly moving chronologically through history.

Graduation!

If the spine is mostly text, you'll also read an illustrated book so that your students get both a narrative and a visual history. For example, Hillyer's *Child's History of the World* is a highly readable, engaging history book, but it lacks illustrations. Several Usborne books, filled with detailed illustrations, show children what Hillyer describes.

On top of the foundations of information and illustration, Sonlight's HBL programs add additional books, mostly biographies and historical fiction.

Geography

To learn Geography, you'll locate the places you read about on your large, *Markable Map*. The level A-J guides also include small laminated maps with locations you learn about indicated. No atlas needed!

And the Sonlight *Timeline Book* has blank pages with dates from 5000 B.C. to the present. For Sonlight A through J, each History package includes pre-gummed timeline figures, with dates, to place in the *Timeline Book*. (In the programs for older students, Sonlight 100 to 500, the IGs include names, dates, and events to write in, without accompanying illustrated stickers.)

A filled *Timeline Book* is an amazing resource: not only a record of people and topics your children have studied, but a cumulative reference to understand history as a whole. As one small example: if you had placed the stickers from Sonlight levels A-D, your page from 1450 to 1475 would show Leonardo da Vinci, Christopher Columbus, Michelangelo, and Aztec emperor Montezuma II. Also some major events: Muslims conquer Constantinople, Ponce de Leon seeks the Fountain of Youth, Balboa discovers the Pacific Ocean, and Vasco da Gama sails to India.

You get all of that in a Sonlight History program: a foundational book or two, additional biographies and historical fiction, geography studies, and a timeline to see the big picture.

Literature

You'll read books in a wide range of literary styles and genres. You may surprise yourself and say, as many have before: "I've never read a book like that before! I'm astonished at how much I enjoyed it!"

When you choose individual books for your children, you'll likely reject one if it seems hard to read or a genre or subject that doesn't much interest you.

But with a Sonlight package, you get a variety of works, most of which are well within your children's reading ability, with some that require your children to concentrate more than normal. When you use a Sonlight package, your children read more widely than they probably would otherwise.

In Sonlight levels A though J, the Literature is divided into two parts: Read-Alouds and Readers. The Read-Alouds you read aloud to your children; the Readers they read to themselves.

Read-Alouds

From the first beautifully illustrated Read-Alouds in Preschool, the titles gradually progress to longer books with more complex plots. They often interweave with your History readings. »

What's in Sonlight?

Carefully chosen to be age-appropriate, the Read-Alouds are weightier books than the Readers, with more challenging vocabulary and more thought-provoking topics.

You have a chance to explain things as you go along, to talk with your children about what you're reading and what you're thinking as you read. This is where true discipleship occurs, where you are talking with your children "when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up" (Deuteronomy 6:7).

Besides a dozen or so books of prose, each Sonlight Read-Aloud package includes at least one book of poetry. Most poetry books are collections of outstanding poems by various authors, though some years focus on the works of a single poet. Poetry books demonstrate unusual uses of language, with each poem offering the gift of a captured moment. Over the years, you will enjoy a wide variety of these gifts.

Readers

Each Sonlight Reader package features fascinating and engrossing stories that will captivate your children's interest and entice them to keep reading.

From the first Reader, the *Fun Tales* booklet "Pam" (which beginning readers can read after learning just six letters), Sonlight's Readers grow progressively more challenging as your children increase reading fluency.

Readers in the early years use simpler vocabulary, simple sentence structures, short paragraphs, large fonts, and fewer words on a page than do Readers in later years.

In the three Sonlight programs that correspond to early elementary school—Levels A, B, and C—you have five different Reader packages to choose from. Because children learn to read at different rates, you

have options. And if you have children of different ages combined together into one program, you can choose separate Reader packages that will best meet each of your children's unique abilities.

With Sonlight, you get the materials and guidance you need to homeschool with confidence





Still, given that human beings are made in God's image, Christians who work with human remains for scientific purposes should do so with "trembling awe," as C.S. Lewis put it (God in the Dock, "Vivisection," p. 226). [p. 136]

Teaching Multiple Students?

If you are teaching multiple children, instead of just one, be encouraged—teaching multiple children with Sonlight is easier than you might expect.

Unlike a traditional textbook approach, you don't have to order a separate Sonlight program for each child. You can combine multiple children for Couch Subjects (think

Help your children become excellent writers

Workbooks don't really teach children how to write effectively," says Dr. Ruth Beechick, homeschool expert and author of *The Three R's* (Sonlight item KL01). Instead, students learn to write well as they listen to good writing, copy good writing, and write on their own.

"Benjamin Franklin taught himself to write this way," explains Dr. Beechick. "He outlined essays he admired, put them aside for a few days, and later tried to rewrite the original article by following his outline. He compared his writing with the model to see where he fell short. Then he tried another, improving his writing all the while."

In Sonlight Language Arts, children follow a similar natural approach, as they learn to write by studying good writing and then imitating what they've observed. The natural learning method is not like a traditional workbook method. In natural learning, your children will make a discovery, which will be reinforced, but they won't find 50

similar problems neatly laid out for them to solve, as they might find in a workbook.







This Portland University program has won its share of accolades. We added it to the product line when one of our sons, whose handwriting was atrocious, began making noticeable strides from the first day.

Its cursive characters are almost identical to its print characters, so the transition from print to cursive is easy. The attractive text is similar to calligraphy. (A student won a national writing contest with this style.)



Miquon teaches all four arithmetic operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) beginning the first year, and even introduces algebraic notation, geometry, and diagram-reading in the first book.



Because parents and children work together to share ideas and discoveries, Miquon may require a greater time investment than other programs.


The Role of the Parents

Planning Your Students' High School Years

Although high school might seem overwhelming, the reality is: it's just the next thing.

Ideally, before your children begin high school, you'll check your state requirements for graduation. This ensures that you won't forget required classes (some states require health, or government, or public speaking). It will also give you some perspective on how many classes your children will need to complete each year, and what kinds of classes are required (how many math, science, language arts, and history classes).

With the requirements in mind, you can chart a rough plan for the next four years. This will almost certainly change, but you'll be able to order with confidence, knowing you have the basics covered.

At the high school level, certain elective courses are often required for graduation, such as foreign language. Other electives, while not necessary, are highly desirable, such as public speaking, driver's ed, and psychology. Economics is often required, while money management is desirable.

If you feel intimidated about planning for high school, order Lee Binz's *HomeScholar's Guide to College Admission and Scholarships* (item number 680-02, p. 153).

Parents who have homeschooled through high school say that the high school years feel like the beginning of the harvest of good fruit in their children. As you homeschool the high school years, may you enjoy the fruit of your labor. •





Introductory Comments

Lewis writes with such ease and grace that it's easy for me to be carried along with the lovely words, the interesting plot, and forget the depths in this story.

This is a lovely book, but not an easy one. On its first reading, you won't get as much as you will the second time, should you choose to read it again.

Watch for references to faces: the book is sprinkled with

them.
As I understand it, Lewis wrote this book to illustrate his theory of love in his book The Four Loves. Lewis believes,

"that just as Lucifer—a former archangel—perverted himself by pride and fell into depravity, so too can love— commonly held to be the arch-emotion—become corrupt by presuming itself to be what it is not" (from Wikipedia).

And, indeed, the main love in this book twists on itself, as you will read.

For what it's worth, Wikipedia explains the four loves thus: "1) affection: or fondness through familiarity; 2) friendship: between family and friends, a weak bond between those who share common interest or activity; 3) romance: the emotional connection, "being in love" (Lewis: Venus demands sexuality, while Eros wants con nection); 4) unconditional love: "love that brings forth caring regardless of circumstance. Lewis recognizes this as the greatest of loves, and sees it as a specifically Christian virtue. The chapter on the subject focuses on the need of subordinating the natural loves to the love of God, who is full of charitable love."

Note: At the very back of this book, the author retell: the story of Cupid and Psyche. If you don't have an idea of their story already, it would be good to begin your reading with that.



Your kids don't like reading

Sonlight's programs center on books and reading. You'll read forty or so books in most Sonlight programs.



These are excellent books. Part of what makes a book great is your emotional connection with the characters, and a story with emotional depth. Sonlight books are great, so you'll have emotional connection. (Read Sarita's 7-point criteria for "Sonlight all-star" books on p. 9.)

Beyond that, from an educational perspective, students remember much more of what they have read when they have connected emotionally with the story and characters.

Depth of emotion also helps your children develop moral imagination. As your children begin to understand, through stories, how the world looks and feels to others, they develop the capacity to empathize with others and to understand how their actions affect the lives of others—far better than if they only understand *intellectually* that their actions have consequences.

This is why we include books that move us.

You don't want to expose your extra sensitive child to natural disasters or other real world experiences

For most children, Sonlight books are ageappropriate. They are funny, poignant, exciting, and interesting books that deal with real life in thoughtful, gentle ways. They are not meant to be shocking, aggressive or inappropriate.

And yet they do deal with real life.

If your children become upset if they hear about volcanoes or other natural disasters, or if even the mention of the word "soldier" makes them cry, Sonlight might not be a good fit for your family.

Some families find that there are certain books they might set aside for the time being.

Often though, we find that children are eased gently into stories that help them process the world around them: the beauty and joy, and yes, sometimes pain, that is involved.

You expect the Instructor's Guide to be a taskmaster and not a guide

Your Sonlight IG is merely a schedule, a record, not a standard to hold yourself to.

Most parents pick and choose among the suggested assignments. Even if they read most of the books, they might ignore some of the comprehension questions, or skip some of the writing assignments.

Some people don't get to the timeline figures during the school year, and spend a few hours during the last week of school, putting a full year's worth of timeline figures onto their timelines all at once—a year-end review!

Some parents allow their children to drop two Readers a year, so their children only read fifteen or so books.

Some will just use the *Discover & Do* DVDs in lieu of experiments in the early years.

Or they will do the Read-Alouds at night, as bedtime stories. Or they will read some of the Read-Alouds during the summer, when the children are bored And, with all of these options, they are still fantastic parents who have given their children a terrific education.

The IG is a Guide, not a taskmaster.

You want your children to be following the same sequence as your local school district

In the early grades, you can be almost assured that students in one school will have learned some things that their peers in another school have not. Different curricula follow their own order. But notice the qualifier: in the early grades.

Over time, the differences disappear. In fact, because Sonlighters learn so much and, in »

general, become such eager learners, you are likely eventually to tell a story like this one from Christy H of Galena, MO. She had sometimes wondered whether her children were learning enough.

When my kids randomly bring school into conversations with others—for example, when my 8-year-old discusses ancient Egypt and Rome with my cousin who is a history major in college, or when my 6-year-old explains to her fisherman grandpa why his boat floats. . . . Then I know we are doing okay!

When you consider the quantity of reading, and the wide range of books and characters your children will meet in Sonlight, you will find that they will readily and knowledgeably engage with people on an astonishing variety of topics.

With a Sonlight education, your children will not merely absorb basic information, but, far more, they'll develop an inquisitive spirit and love for learning.

You want your children to lead their course of study

Sonlight Curriculum is structured—more so from Sonlight D on. However, just because the Instructor's Guide plots a course of study, you don't have to do precisely what it says. Sonlight Instructor's Guides are designed so you can readily modify the program. In fact, some unschoolers have appreciated having the foundational structure Sonlight offers: it gave them more confidence to launch out on their own beyond what the Instructor's Guide suggested. They have woven their free-form program around the Sonlight base.

If you love the idea of lots of literature, and are willing to modify the program to meet your needs, you should do just fine with Sonlight.

You want Scripture on every page of your teacher's manual

Sonlight academics are based on, and intentionally related to, Scripture, and the hope is that Scripture changes Sonlighters into the likeness of Christ. Bible reading, Christian teaching, and memory verses are an integral part of each Sonlight HBL program. In G through high school, rigorous Bible study (including apologetics and Church history) is woven into the programs.

But not every page in the IGs has a Scripture quotation.

When a passage of Scripture provides insight or understanding to a subject, the IG will often mention it. But in general, the Sonlight approach is to provide rich materials that help you engage in more natural conversations about Scripture with your children.

When you read *The Hundred Dresses* in Sonlight A, for example, the story itself presents wonderful opportunities to discuss Biblical principles in real-life settings. Why should we care for others? What does kindness look like? How do we stand up for what is right?

Instead of specific Bible lessons, Sonlight allows you to decide what is most applicable to discuss as you read the Bible daily. Depending on the unique needs of your children, you can teach whatever character principle you want to focus on then.

You don't want to own books that assume evolution

Some of the books in both the Sonlight History

and Science programs assume an evolutionary/old-earth perspective.

Usually, when a book has evolutionary content, the IG offers notes so you can discuss the different perspectives on the beginning of the universe with your children.

But if you'd rather not own books that assume evolution, Sonlight will not be a good fit for you.

You want a religiously neutral program

Most Sonlight books—ninety percent or more—are non-religious.

But the Sonlight Instructor's Guides (IGs) are not religiously neutral.

The IG authors come from a biblical, evangelical Christian perspective. They believe that the Bible is the Word of God and speaks to the issues of today.

Even if you don't use Sonlight's Bible program, Sonlight will not offer you a religiously neutral curriculum, nor will you avoid all references to God, the Bible, or Christianity.

You want to study American History every year

Western culture—and American society in particular within the last 150 years—has enriched the world in many ways. With Sonlight, you'll learn about its unique contributions with four solid years of U.S. history and culture.

But Sonlight also devotes eight years to the rest of the world, including not only Western history

and culture, but the cultures and histories of Asia, Africa, the Middle East, and indigenous peoples elsewhere around the world.

With Sonlight, your children are prepared not only to think about, pray for, and serve Americans, but peoples and cultures around the world—wherever God may lead them.

Of course, from a secular perspective, we live in an increasingly globalized world. As international commerce increases, you may have practical reasons for your children to study the cultures and peoples beyond America's borders as well, offering them the knowledge and capacity to transcend national boundaries.

You don't want your teacher's notes to come from American conservative Christians

The primary Sonlight developers—John and Sarita Holzmann—are evangelical Christian, middle-class, Americans. Born and raised in the United States, they are the children of first-and second-generation European immigrants. As John said,

"We are grateful to God and to our parents for the

heritage we enjoy. Yet we recognize that our backgrounds mean our perspectives are limited, though we seek to be as sensitive as possible to those from other backgrounds.

"If you are looking for a broad-based, internationally-focused curriculum that is deeply committed to looking at issues from 'all sides,' and if you can overlook some of our (usually unwitting) American provincialisms, we expect we can provide the kind of educational program you are looking for."

John and Sarita have attended a wide range of Bible-believing churches over the years, though they do not push a particular Christian denomination or theology.

Sonlight is delighted to serve people who live in over 150 different countries and who come from Catholic, Seventh Day Adventist, Mormon, Muslim, Jewish, and other religious persuasions as well.

But please realize up front—Sonlight's developers come from a particular perspective.

You prefer frequent, written tests

From its foundation, Sonlight was designed to capitalize on the efficient, tutorial environment of the home.

Because you're in daily, personal, one-on-one contact with your students (unlike the relationship that exists between most classroom teachers and their students), you'll be able to evaluate the progress of your students through means other than quizzes, tests and gradable worksheets.

When you're reading a book, you'll likely discuss it with your children: "Why do you think he wanted to do that?" "What does _____ mean?"

If your children are able to answer your questions, you will know exactly how much they have understood—or how much they have failed to understand.

Such methods for gauging progress should give you the feedback you need to be confident in your children's day-to-day progress.

But what if your children need to transfer to a classroom, or need to take the SAT or ACT in anticipation of attending college?

These are good questions. Two possible answers:

- Some Math programs, and all the Apologia Science programs, include tests. As you anticipate a transition, you can give your children practice with these kinds of tests.
- 2. Depending on where you live, your state may require annual or intermittent standardized testing. And whether required or not, you can have your children complete standardized tests on an occasional basis so you know if you are missing some key skill or subject matter. The standardized tests will give your children practice at test-taking, can give you some hints about where you may want to beef up your teaching, and, actually, may encourage you about how well you are doing! (Sarita herself discovered the benefits of testing with her children. She had assumed that since she taught her children to read using phonics, they would know all the rules, that spelling would make sense, and that they would be good »

spellers. It wasn't until she had her children take a standardized test that she discovered, "Oops! I need to teach spelling.")

Homeschooling doesn't have to be school-at-home regarding tests and measuring . . . unless you want it to be.

You want handson activities every day

Sonlight does include hands-on activities. But hands-on has never been our emphasis. We believe that the educational value of many activities often aren't worth the hours of preparation the parents must complete.

So, more often than not, we encourage you that as your children read about new places and people, allow them to decide for themselves what activities they want to do. A box, after all, may become their time machine, cave, airplane, or house.

With Sonlight, you'll find some suggestions for hands-on activities in the Science Guides, along with Science experiments. Some books include suggestions of crafts. Many elementary students incorporate hands-on manipulatives with their Math. And, new in 2018, we've included a few hands-on projects that complement a few History / Bible / Literature levels.

You want to teach with worksheets

"My son just does his work and can get on with his day!"

Worksheets are so appealing, aren't they? How much easier to solve the basic Math problem 6-4=2 than it is to solve a word problem. That's because, with word problems, you actually apply what you've learned to something more like the real world. And that usually takes more time and thought.

So, too, with education.

A Sonlight education deals with real-life, practical things that take time and effort to think and talk through.

When, for example, you read the book of Luke with your children, they'll hear Jesus say some really unexpected things: the story of the man who commended the dishonest manager; the worker who hid his money and then gave it to the man who had multiplied his already.

And it will take time to work through what Jesus means.

That's not as easy as answering a catechism question, like "Who was Jesus?" with "God the Son." But it is meaningful.

Not easy, but worthwhile.

And for the worksheet-loving children, they can enjoy Sonlight's Language Arts and Science worksheets, and additional worksheets for Math, Vocabulary, Grammar, and Handwriting. Even with a Sonlight education, you can get in plenty of worksheets. Just not in History and Literature, where the depth and breadth of the information requires more discussion and thought. And, most years, not in Bible, either.

You want to teach all of your children the same materials, no matter the difference in their ages

The claim that you can cover the same material with all of your children, no matter their age, at one time is very enticing. It makes sense that you'd want to do everything together. But, there might be more to consider.

First, while it is true that great literature appeals to a span of ages, it only works so far. Few kindergarten and first grade students will grasp books whose content is designed to challenge their fifth and sixth grade siblings (let alone high school students).

Even beyond basic comprehension, there is the issue of maturity. At a certain point, the range becomes too great and you might find you are not challenging your older students, while at the same time, the younger children are overwhelmed.

So what has Sonlight done to help parents teach multiple students? You'll find age-appropriate programs for Preschool through High School that, because of their literature base, are easy to combine for children within about three years of age. You can use one Sonlight History / Bible / Literature program and one Sonlight Science program for all of them, with skill-based subjects (Math, Language Arts, perhaps Reading instruction) for each. This allows you to keep Sonlight's broad international focus, the great literature base, and the depth of discussions while moving everyone forward at their appropriate levels.

But when the age range between children diverges more widely, separate your children into smaller study groups.

In sum: if your children are spaced more than about three years apart, consider whether you really can teach all of them the same subjects at the same time. There comes a point when your children might benefit from separate programs. Read more about how to teach multiple students on pg. 27.

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You want a four-year, chronological cycle of history

Many homeschoolers like the idea of teaching world history in a four-year cycle, repeated three times over the course of twelve years. It makes sense that History should be taught in chronological order, and it takes about four years to adequately cover history from creation to the modern era.

Every Sonlight History / Bible / Literature package emphasizes Geography and incorporates timeline activities. This ensures that your students will understand the flow of history, the timeline of events. And they also will understand where things happened, among which peoples they occurred, and, most importantly, why.

But rather than following a consistent four-year cycle three times over, Sonlight breaks the pattern by including additional focus on certain places, eras and types of history that a regular four-year cycle might skip.

So, in addition to studying World History over a two-year period in both the early elementary and middle school years, with Sonlight, you'll study:

- * a total of three focused years on American History;
- * a one-year intensive course on the history of the Christian church;
- * 20th century World History an important century for understanding the world today;
- * a year spent on the Eastern Hemisphere, learning about the cultures and practices of the majority of people on earth;
- * a year covering a set of common prerequisites for college: studies in Civil Government and Economics.

Do these breaks in the chronological study confuse children? No. We've found that just like a properly filled in back-story only helps the narrative, so too your students' understanding is enhanced when you see and talk about parallels and contrasts with peoples, cultures, and events of other times and other places.



Chronology is important, but it is not paramount. There are true, compelling reasons to take time to focus on additional studies.
