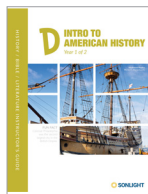

Adoniram Judson

Bengé. The thrilling story of America's first foreign missionary, Adoniram Judson. In the face of incredible obstacles, Adoniram and his wife Ann were the spark that spread the fire of the Gospel into Burma. Their evident love for the Burmese people is a compelling story of unswerving dedication and sacrifice. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 3-A

Carry On, Mr. Bowditch

Latham. Newbery Award. Fascinating true story of the poor apprentice who, shortly after the American

Revolution, transformed navigation from an art to a precise science. Bowditch wrote a book that is still a standard reference among mariners. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

A Child's Introduction to Poetry

Driscoll. Subtitled "Listen While You Learn About the Magic Words That Have Moved Mountains, Won Battles, and Made Us Laugh and Cry." This collection of 64 poems for children (from Homer to Maya Angelou) first teaches about many forms of poetry—such as nursery rhyme, ballad, haiku, sonnet. Then the reader meets each poet in brief, lively mini-biographies. For days when you can't read aloud together, they can read along and listen to a professional actor read each selection on the companion CD. Fun and inviting. Illustrated. Hb. RA: 2-A; R: 3-A

Johnny Tremain

Forbes. A young apprentice silversmith is caught up in the Boston Tea Party and the American Revolution. An exciting story, winner of the Newbery Award. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

Justin Morgan Had a Horse

Henry. Newbery Honor. The true story of a young boy who trained the first all-American (but now world-famous) Morgan horse. Pb, illus. RA: 2-A; R: 4-A

Peacemaker

Bruchac. A twelve-year-old Iroquois boy searches for peace in this historical novel based on the creation of the Iroquois Confederacy. Pb.

The Sign of the Beaver

Speare. Newbery Honor. A white boy left alone in the Maine wilderness barely manages to survive. This is the inspiring story of the boy's friendship. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

The Story of the Amistad

Sterne. This gripping, fast-paced book tells the dramatic story of the epic 1839 voyage of the schooner Amistad and her cargo of Africans bound for slavery in the New World. Pb.

Toliver's Secret

Brady. Ten-year-old Ellen Toliver must conquer her timidity to take a secret message through enemy lines during the Revolutionary War. Fast-paced novel gives a good feel for the era. Illustrated. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 4-A

Walk the World's Rim

Baker. A 14-year-old Indian joins Cabeza de Vaca's 16th Century expedition through the Southwest. A vivid portrait of Mexican life and the harsh conditions of a primitive Indian tribe. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

The Witch of Blackbird Pond

Speare. Newbery Medal. A girl who was raised in luxury in the Caribbean struggles to adjust to Puritan New England. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

The Journeyman

Yates. Touching story about a boy, despised by his father because of his artistic bent, who leaves home to find his place in the world. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 5-A

Winter Danger

Steele. Cajé Amos's father trained him to be independent, not to be beholden. When harsh Tennessee weather forces them to take refuge with Cajé's aunt and uncle, Cajé not only must survive bears, wolves, illness, and starvation, but he needs to learn to be part of a family. A riveting historical novel by a Newbery Honor author. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 3-A

Carbone. Twelve-year-old Samuel Collier is a lowly commoner on the streets of London. So when he becomes the page of Captain John Smith and boards the Susan Constant, bound for the New World, he can't believe his good fortune. Pb.

The Cabin Faced West

Fritz. Anne is lonely when her family moves to the Pennsylvania frontier...until a special evening when a stranger comes to dinner. Laura Ingalls Wilder Medalist. Pb. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-6

The Corn Grows Ripe

Rhoads. Carefree Tigre must learn responsibility after his father is injured. Set in a Mayan village, this Newbery Honor book portrays a marvelous coming-of-age story in an unusual setting. Pb. **Illus. RA:** 1-A **RA:** 3-7

Fever 1793

Anderson. An epidemic of fever sweeps through the streets of 1793 Philadelphia in this novel from Laurie Halse Anderson where "the plot rages like the epidemic itself" (The New York Times Book Review). Pb.

Jericho's Journey

Wisler. Young Jericho Wetherby, longing for adventure, is delighted when his father decides to leave Tennessee for Texas. Jericho's life as a pioneer teaches him about growing up. Drawn from an actual settler's diary. Pb. **RA:** 2-8; **R:** 3-8

Naya Nuki

Thomasma. The dramatic adventure of a real-life childhood friend of Sacajawea who was kidnapped by a rival tribe. Naya Nuki escaped her captors and traveled alone in the wilderness for more than a month to return to her people. Pb, **illus. RA:** K-7; **R:** 3-7

Om-kas-toe

Thomasma. Om-kas-toe is a member of the Blackfeet Indian tribe in the early 1700s—before horses. He has the privilege of helping to bring the first elk dog (horse) into his tribe. An exciting, authentic look at life among the American Indians prior to the coming of European men. Pb, **illus. RA:** 2-7; **R:** 4-7

Phoebe the Spy

Griffin. Dramatic true story of a little black girl who foiled a plan to kill George Washington. Pb. **RA:** K-A; **R:** 3-6

Sarah, Plain and Tall

MacLachlan. Newbery Award-winning story of a frontier American widower who advertises for a wife... and gets Sarah. Poignant. Beautiful. Pb. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-A

Sarah Whitcher's Story

Yates. The true story of a little girl who is lost in New Hampshire woods back in pioneer days. A father's Christian faith bolsters the spirits of searchers who want to give up. Gripping. Pb, **illus. RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-A

The Secret of the Sealed Room

MacDonald. Young Patience Martin works as an indentured servant in 1721 Boston. When her mistress dies of a mysterious poisoning, Patience runs away and meets an inventive, adventurous young printer's apprentice named Ben Franklin. Can the new friends crack the case and save Patience's life? This historical fiction mystery is filled with suspense, danger, and wit. A fun guess at what Benjamin Franklin was like as a boy. Hb. **RA:** K-A; **R:** 3-8

The Skippack School

De Angeli. Simple but insightful story about a German boy who immigrated to America about the year 1750. One becomes dramatically aware of some of the cultural shifts that have taken place in the last 200 years! Written by a multiple award-winning author. Pb, **illus. RA:** 1-6; **R:** 3-6

Squanto, Friend of the Pilgrims

Bulla. The story of the meeting of two cultures—and the young man who helped bridge the gap between them. Pb, **illus. RA:** 1-6; **R:** 3-6

The Thanksgiving Story

Dalglish. Caldecott Honor Book recounts the story of the Pilgrims from the time they left England on the Mayflower through the first Thanksgiving celebration. Told from the perspective of children, with careful attention to accuracy. Pb, **illus. RA:** P-6; **R:** 3-6

Timmy O'Dowd and the Big Ditch

Hilts. In the late 1800s, young Timmy O'Dowd and his city boy cousin must forget their differences and combine their efforts when the Erie Canal is damaged by storms. Pb. **RA:** K-6; **R:** 3-6

Dalglish. Newbery Honor. Jonathan goes to get "the biggest pot you ever laid eyes on"—on the other side of Hemlock Mountain. How he protects himself from the bears is the highlight of this short tall tale! Pb, **illus. RA:** K-A; **R:** 3-4

Ben Franklin of Old Philadelphia

Cousins. A sympathetic, conversational account of Ben Franklin's life. Highlights his inventions, his writing and editorial work, and his statesmanship. Very pleasant! Pb, includes index. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-A

The Courage of Sarah Noble

Dalglish. Newbery Honor. Eight-year old Sarah journeys into the wilderness with her father—and ends up alone! Based on a true story. Pb. **RA:** K-6; **R:** 3-6

A Lion to Guard Us

Bulla. Award-winning author tells a true story about three children, left alone in London in 1609, who make their way to the Virginia colony. Engrossing! Pb. **RA:** 1-6; **R:** 3-6

Stone Fox

Gardiner. Ten-year-old Willy needs to win the big dogsled race in order to pay the back taxes on his grandfather's farm—but that means he has to beat Stone Fox and his incredible dogsled team. A stunning, heartwarming story. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 3-A
