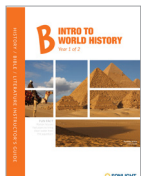

Gooney Bird Greene

☐ Lowry. Gooney Bird dazzles (and inspires) her classmates with "absolutely true" stories, while they learn what makes a story good or bad. ☐ Bulla. Dick Park is the son of a Pony Express rider, Katy Kelly is the daughter of a way station master, and Little Bear is an Indian boy who lives nearby. How the three friends keep the mail moving is just part of this fast-moving tale about the great experiment in transcontinental communication. Pb, illus. **RA:** K-4; **R:** 2-4

The Secret Valley

☐ Bulla. What do you do when you've left your home in Missouri to prospect for gold in California...but when

you arrive, there is no gold to be found? The Davis family has to face this disappointment and decide where true wealth and happiness may be found Pb, illus. **RA:** K-4; **R:** 2-4

Third Grade Detectives #1 and #2

☐ Stanley. This book has two mysteries: *The Clue of the Left-Hand Envelope* and *The Puzzle of the Pretty Pink Handkerchief*. In the first mystery, someone sent Amber a secret-admirer letter, and Noelle and Todd want to find out who did it.
