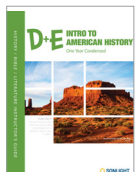

An excellent tool for teaching preteens how to study the Bible on their own. Includes stories, stickers, questions and activities. Uses, but is not dependent upon, *The Living Bible*. ☐ Smithsonian. A groundbreaking guide to American history, this reference book explains events, moments, trends, patterns, and people in concise articles designed to appeal to children ages 8 and up. Features more than 750 photos and artworks, plus extensive maps, charts, a state-by-state review, the complete texts of the Declaration of Independence and U.S. Constitution, and much more. Hb. Hero Over Here

☐ Kudlinski. Theodore learns that heroism requires more—and less—than he imagined in this story set during the deadly flu epidemic at the end of World War I. Moving. S Pb, illus. RA: 1-6; R: 4-6

Boorstin focuses on the social forces and cultural influences that have made Americans the unique people they are. ☐ Boorstin. A fascinating introduction to American culture as it has shaped and been shaped by events from the Civil War to the late 20th century. Written by the former Librarian of Congress. Updated full-color edition, completed revised for readability. Now includes timelines, maps and more than twice the illustrations. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 3-A

Patriotic Kids Songs

☐ 18 patriotic songs by Cooltime Kids. With updated kid-sung versions of the all-time greatest patriotic tracks that'll remind you why you love the Red, White, & Blue. Runtime: 44 minutes

Pedro's Journal

☐ Conrad. An account of Christopher Columbus' first voyage of discovery to the New World, supposedly written by his young cabin boy. Delightfully realistic. Pb, illus. RA: 3-8; R: 4-8

Across Five Aprils

☐ Hunt. Newbery Honor. The powerful story of a young man during the five Aprils of the Civil War. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

Adoniram Judson

☐ Bengé. The thrilling story of America's first foreign missionary, Adoniram Judson. In the face of incredible obstacles, Adoniram and his wife Ann were the spark that spread the fire of the Gospel into Burma. Their evident love for the Burmese people is a compelling story of unswerving dedication and sacrifice. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 3-A

Caddie Woodlawn

☐ Brink. Newbery Medalist. Caddie has great adventures with her two brothers in the Wild West frontiers of Wisconsin in the late 1800s. Indians, raging rivers, massacre scares, loving family life are all here. Caddie is one of my favorite heroines. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 4-A

Carry On, Mr. Bowditch

☐ Latham. Newbery Award. Fascinating true story of the poor apprentice who, shortly after the American Revolution, transformed navigation from an art to a precise science. Bowditch wrote a book that is still a standard reference among mariners. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

How to Eat a Poem

☐ No author. Seventy charming poems cover a wide range of subjects: poetry, books, words, and imagination; the beauty of the natural world; travel, adventure, sports, and play; love, friendship, sadness, hope, and other emotions. Pb

In the Year of the Boar and Jackie Robinson

☐ Lord. A ten-year-old Chinese girl emigrates to America. After earning the friendship of the toughest girl in class, she is included in the playground stickball games and becomes a loyal fan of the Brooklyn Dodgers. Humorous and thought-provoking. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 4-A

Johnny Tremain

☐ Forbes. A young apprentice silversmith is caught up in the Boston Tea Party and the American Revolution. An exciting story, winner of the Newbery Award. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

Little Britches

☐ Moody. Classic true story of ranching in Colorado in the early 1900's. A delight. Pb, illus. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

Miracles on Maple Hill

☐ Sorensen. A heartwarming Newbery Medal winner. Dad has returned from World War II a changed man: withdrawn, touchy, unable to work. The family moves back to the family farm where dad gets the healing he needs. Includes a great description of maple sugaring. Pb. RA: 2-A; R: 4-A

Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry

☐ Taylor. Newbery Medal winner about the post-Civil War South. The Taylors are one of the few black families to own land: a cause for racial tensions and strife. A story of overcoming unjust opposition. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 6-A

Walk the World's Rim

☐ Baker. A 14-year-old Indian joins Cabeza de Vaca's 16th Century expedition through the Southwest. A vivid portrait of Mexican life and the harsh conditions of a primitive Indian tribe. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

The Witch of Blackbird Pond

☐ Speare. Newbery Medal. A girl who was raised in luxury in the Caribbean struggles to adjust to Puritan New England. Pb. RA: 3-A; R: 5-A

☐ Carbone. Twelve-year-old Samuel Collier is a lowly commoner on the streets of London. So when he becomes the page of Captain John Smith and boards the

☐ Fleischman. To save his sister's home, young Jack and his butler rush off to California to join the '49ers in their hunt for gold. Fun! Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-8

Freedom Train:

The Story of Harriet Tubman

☐ Sterling. Fascinating biography of Harriet Tubman, a black woman who risked her life helping other slaves reach freedom on the Underground Railroad. Pb. **RA:** 1-7; **R:** 4-7

The Great Turkey Walk

☐ Karr. "Git along, little . . . turkeys"? Yep! In this sure-fire funny-bone tickler, part tall-tale but mostly solid historical yarn, fifteen-year-old Simon Green proves he's a man, and worthy of respect, as he escorts a thousand turkeys on a turkey drive (the turkey equivalent of a cattle drive). Great fun! Pb. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 4-A

The Great Wheel

☐ Lawson. Engrossing story about the first—and largest—Ferris Wheel ever built. Told by one of the workers who built it. Newbery Honor. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-A

The Lewis & Clark Expedition

☐ Neuberger. A highly readable account of the quintessentially American adventure of discovery and hardship as Meriwether Lewis and William Clark led their men on an exploration of "the interior parts of North America." Pb, illus. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-A

Old Yeller

☐ Gipson. The touching Newbery Honor story about a boy and the dog he loves. Set during frontier days in the Texas hill country. Pb. **RA:** 3-A; **R:** 4-A

Om-kas-toe

☐ Thomasma. Om-kas-toe is a member of the Blackfeet Indian tribe in the early 1700s—before horses. He has the privilege of helping to bring the first elk dog (horse) into his tribe. An exciting, authentic look at life among the American Indians prior to the coming of European men. Pb, illus. **RA:** 2-7; **R:** 4-7

Phoebe the Spy

☐ Griffin. Dramatic true story of a little black girl who foiled a plan to kill George Washington. Pb. **RA:** K-A; **R:** 3-6

Pocahontas and the Strangers

☐ Bulla. Familiar story of a young Indian girl who saved the life of John Smith, an early American frontiersman. Pb. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-6

Sarah, Plain and Tall

☐ MacLachlan. Newbery Award-winning story of a frontier American widower who advertises for a wife... and gets Sarah. Poignant. Beautiful. Pb. **RA:** 1-A; **R:** 3-A

The Seventeenth Swap

☐ McGraw. Eric wants to get a special gift for his friend Jimmy. Since he doesn't have money, he has to wheel and deal through seventeen swaps. Along the way, he learns some surprising things about himself—which is why the seventeenth swap is best of all. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-A

A Summer of Sundays

☐ Eland. Middle child Sunday Fowler is too young for her sisters and too old for her brothers. How can she stand out in such a large family? Her opportunity comes when the family moves to a small town so her father can renovate the town library, and she discovers a mysterious manuscript in the basement. Charming. Pb. **RA:** 3-7; **R:** 4-7

Shades of Gray

☐ Reeder. Thought-provoking story of a boy who was orphaned by the Civil War as he struggles to forgive "the enemy"—and discover what true courage is all about. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-A

The Sign of the Beaver

☐ Speare. Newbery Honor. A white boy left alone in the Maine wilderness barely manages to survive. This is the inspiring story of the boy's friendship. Pb. **RA:** 3-A; **R:** 5-A

Thimble Summer

☐ Enright. Newbery Medal winner about a mid-American farm family in the early 20th Century. Charming. Pb.: 4-7

Toliver's Secret

☐ Brady. Ten-year-old Ellen Toliver must conquer her timidity to take a secret message through enemy lines during the Revolutionary War. Fast-paced novel gives a good feel for the era. Illustrated. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-A

Turn Homeward, Hannalee

☐ Beatty. Two thousand Georgia textile workers were shipped North against their will to work in Yankee mills. Twelve-year old Hannalee was one of them. This is the true story of how she fulfilled her promise to return home. Pb. **RA:** 3-A; **R:** 4-A

What's the Big Idea, Ben Franklin?

☐ Breezy biography by award-winning author gives insights into Franklin's intriguing life and personality.

The Wright Brothers

☐ Reynolds. A delightful account of the exploits, the family life, and the character of the two bike builders who are credited with the first powered flight. Pb. **RA:** 2-A; **R:** 4-8
